Recreation Passport Replaces Michigan State Park Sticker

The Recreation Passport is Michigan's solution for funding your favorite recreation destinations, and it begins **October 1**, **2010**.

Instead of spending \$24 for an annual motor vehicle permit or boating access permit, you will now be asked to support the Recreation Passport with a \$10 fee when renewing your vehicle registration with the Secretary of State.

When you opt-in, your \$10 will do so much more than get you into the state parks:

- 80% will be used to rebuild and maintain your state parks and recreation areas.
- 10% will be directed to your county, city and township parks through grant funding.
- 7% will go toward your state forest campgrounds, pathways and non-motorized trails.
- 2.75% will support your state park cultural and historic resources.
- · 0.25% will be used to educate and update you on the value of the Recreation Passport.

Opt-in and preserve parks for generations to come! Since 2004, Michigan State Parks and Recreation Areas have received no state tax support and are primarily funded through user fees.

The Recreation Passport legislation was created to prevent drastic cuts to park and forest programs - and it will take the support of outdoor enthusiasts like you to make the idea a reality. Opt-in on every vehicle you register to support green spaces and recreation in your community and throughout Michigan.

Additional Info You Need to Know:

- Supporting the Recreation Passport gives you access to all 98 state parks and recreation areas, 133 state forest campgrounds, 879 miles of trails, and every state-administered boating access site in Michigan.
- · Camping fees will remain in effect.
- When registering a motorcycle, the fee requested is just \$5.
- There will be a designation on your normal license plate registration sticker to indicate you have paid. Entering a park without opting-in will result in paying a Recreation Passport fee of up to \$20 or could result in a \$100 fine..
- Out of state visitors will still pay the \$8 daily, or \$29 annual fee for park and/or boating access site entrance.

He was also proud of his 40' Class A diesel-pusher motor home and the fact that Marianne could not only drive it, but park it. In fact, Tony took a lot of pride in everything he did and inspired those close to him to do the same. It was extremely touching to hear testimonials from family members stating that they never once heard Tony complain and he refused to let his handicap stand in the way of achieving his goals. It was an honor and a privilege to be asked to give the following eulogy at Tony's funeral.

The Family Campers and RVers considers itself a camping family and Tony's absence will leave a huge void in our family. Tony and Marianne were very active in Family Campers, and I know there were times when our activities conflicted with events taking place among his real family. And we thank you for sharing him with us for so many years. We campers enjoy camping all year long, adjusting our activities to the various seasons of the year. As I was trying to come up with memories to share about our Tony, I saw a parallel between his multi-faceted personality and the four seasons we enjoy in Michigan. Like the fall foliage, Tony wore a coat of many colors. He was a leader as well as a worker. He was both compassionate and (constructively) critical. He was generous as an individual, yet frugal when spending Association funds. But he was always fair. We could count on Tony's humor to pull us through a sticky situation. To those few with whom he disagreed, Tony's words could be as brisk as a cold winter wind. Like the crocus that bursts through the frozen ground in early spring, Tony would never give up. He never let his handicap stop him from flipping pancakes while leaning on a crutch, crawling under a rig to make a repair, or getting wherever he needed to be. Tony and Marianne managed to be in a lot of places

 he was president of his chapter, Tails-A-Wagon; was appointed Assistant State Director; and coordinated golf cart rentals at our national campvention for many years. The summer season describes Tony the best the warmth of his eyes and the radiant smile. Tony's embrace could make one feel as if they'd been kissed by the summer sun. While Tony had many good friends in Family Campers, the young people held a special place in his heart. He was an avid supporter of our teens, cheering at their sports events and making sure they had money for pizza after the game. When our teens needed a first-aid kit, Tony provided one.
