FCRV National President's Update – May, 2014

The camping season is well underway here in Missouri for 2014, as I hope it is for you as well. Debbie and I have attended a chapter campout, a District campout, and a State campout as well as the Retiree Rally so far this year. I hope you are all taking advantage of the camping opportunities that our organization has to offer.

The Trustees met two weeks ago to finalize the budget for our organization for the fiscal year 2014 – 2015. Despite diligent efforts, we could not come up with a balanced budget. We did come up with a budget that we feel is workable for the next year. With the loss of ANPAC as a corporate sponsor and the declining membership resulting in loss of dues revenue, the creation of a budget will continue to be a daunting challenge in the years to come. Without a growth in membership and/or an increase in our non-dues revenue stream such as attendance at national rallies and additional commercial memberships, our financial picture will continue to look very bleak. The only other option is to make some very significant cuts to our expenses, the result of which could leave us with a completely different organization than what we have today. I urge you to share this message with the members of your states and provinces. As we have stated throughout the past few years, membership growth is absolutely necessary for us to continue as an organization. The RV industry is continuing to see growth on the manufacturing side with almost yearly increases in units shipped and sold. We have to find ways to get people excited about belonging to our organization. We may have to completely re-think how we recruit new members and what we need to offer our members to keep them active. Please challenge the membership to find new ways to grow our membership. After two months of slight growth, our membership dropped a little at the end of April. The number was 3926 on April 30th.

Continuing on that theme, the last count I heard for registrations at Campvention in Essex Junction, Vermont this year was 184. That is well below the number we need for a monetary break-even. I hope they continue to come in over the next month so that we get to that point. Please continue to advertise Campvention to the members in your states and provinces. The Northeast Region is planning an excellent Campvention for us with several new activities, and it promises to be a fun time for all.

I have formed a Nominating Committee for the Trustee elections this year. Larry Roop has agreed to chair the committee. The members are Sandy Kendall of Nebraska, Pat Parsley of South Carolina, Gilles Dore of Nova Scotia, and Dave Hennie of Ohio. The positions up for election this year are Vice President of Operations, Vice President of Planning and Development, and Comptroller. If any of you are interested in running for one of those positions, or know someone who is, please contact any committee member and make your intentions known. Per current policy, the election will be held next spring with the electees taking office at Campvention in Gillette, Wyoming in July of 2015.

I and the Trustees thank you for all you do for the organization. We are facing a critical time, and with everyone's help we will find ways to improve and make our organization strong.

We will be attending meetings most of the day Sunday, July 6th and plan to arrive in Vermont on Saturday, July 5th.

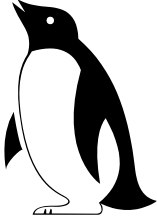

POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director each year for a membership extension. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Reminder for the 2014 State Fall Campout Teen King/Queen Pageant

Original MSA Teen Pageant Rules

1. Both Michigan and National rules apply. In case of conflict between state and National rules, National rules shall prevail.
2. Parents or guardians of contestants must be current members of FCRV, unless contestant is their own FCRV member.
 - A. Names of contestants must be sent to State Director for membership verification 3 weeks prior to pageant.
3. Contestants must be between 13-19 years of age and shall not reach their 20th birthday before the date of National competition.
4. Contestants must complete the official registration form and submit it to the designated person, named on the registration form, by the date shown. A resume must also be sent with the registration form. Pageant Chairperson will send names of all contestants to State Teen Directors for eligibility verification.
5. Contestants must be single and never have been married.

6. In the event the Michigan FCRV Teen King/Queen is unable to fulfill his/her duties or marries during their reign, the first runner-up shall assume the title and be designated to fulfill these duties for the remainder of the reign.
7. In the event the Michigan FCRV Teen Queen cannot attend the National Campvention, in which she is to compete, she shall forfeit her title and the first runner-up shall assume the title and compete.
8. Contestants will be judged at:
 - A. The Interview.
 - B. The Pageant.
9. Contestants will be judged on:
 - A. Interview (Queen)/Personality & Resume (King).
 - B. Adeptness during Skill (King) Talent (Queen)
 - C. Poise & Confidence.
 - D. Escorting Teen Queen contestants during Evening Gown portion (King)/ Evening Gown (Queen).
 - E. Prepared Question.
 - F. There shall be NO swimsuit competition.
10. Queen Contestant Talent shall be:

- A. Any presentation that can be demonstrated on stage, such as,
 1. Performing arts
 2. Non-performing arts
- B. Limited to three (3) minutes. There shall be:
 1. One (1) additional minute allowed without penalty.
 2. A deduction from the total talent score of five (5) points for each fifteen (15) seconds beyond four (4) minutes.
 3. Acts considered safe to the people involved and the property in the area.
THERE IS TO BE NO FIRE BATON ACTS OR OTHER SIMILAR ACTS.
- C. If you are playing an instrument, you must provide your own instrument and music stand.

NOTE: Previous Number 11 and 12 rules for King Contestants are replaced by the national rules adopted for Campvention 2014 below.

Rules for Teen King Contestants – implemented Campvention 2014

- A. Parents or legal guardians of contestants must be members of FCRV, or the teen must be a member of FCRV.
- B. Age limit is 13 to 19 inclusive. The contestant must be 13 to 19 years old on the day of the contest at the National Campvention.
- C. All national contestants must be a state/provincial representative. Only one contestant per state/province entered by the state/provincial director.
- D. The contestant must be single and at no time have been married. The contestant's moral character should exemplify the goals of FCRV by exhibiting wholesome and respected qualities associated with family oriented values.

Rules for Teen King Contestants (continued)

- E. Contestant must complete official registration blank and return to the National Pageant Chairman by the date specified on the blank.
- F. Contestant must be registered with the National Contest Committee no later than 9:00 a.m. Monday (Campvention time). Contestant must be present at the time of judging.
- G. Contestant will be judged in a Campvention or FCRV shirt and shorts, that will be purchased prior to Campvention, for the poise and confidence portion, in a business attire, suit and tie at the tea and in a suit and tie at the evening pageant. Contestants will be judged on communication, personality, formal wear, and talent/skills challenge. Talent/skills challenge is not limited to performing arts; it may be displayed in any category as long as it can be performed on stage and is an "individual" talent. Talent/skills challenge is limited up to three minutes duration with one minute allowed for run over. Skills challenge is a pre-determined "competition" to be completed by all king contestants. Such as: Spelling-tricky everyday words, Golf-nearest to the hole, a short chip shot, Lego-building the tallest structure, Cake-decorating/icing cake. Five points will be deducted for each 15 seconds, or fraction thereof, over the four minute limit, from the judges composite talent/skills challenge score for any contestant exceeding the limit.
- H. FCRV Teen King will relinquish his title if during the year he becomes married, conducts himself in a manner that is contrary to the goals of FCRV, or for any other reason he cannot complete his reign. The 1st runner-up will accept the title of FCRV Teen King for the remainder of the year. FCRV Teen King will be required to return his crown.
- I. The King and all his attendants (2) will be in the annual FCRV parade.
- J. Once a boy has won the title of FCRV Teen King, he cannot compete in the FCRV Teen King Contest again. However, boys who have not won FCRV Teen King title but have been on the court can compete again. He cannot sit on the court during the contest, if he is a contestant.

Teen Pageant Registration deadline is August 1.
