Scholarship News

In the September issue of *The Michigander* and at the November MSA meeting, I reported the revisions to the Scholarship by-laws. As a reminder, the following changes become effective **January 1, 2016**:

- 1) Application deadline: June 1st
- 2) All applications mailed by U.S. mail must have a legible post office marked date stamp on the envelope to be accepted for judging. Applications emailed will be accepted by the date and time on the email.
- 3) Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale.
- 4) The applicant **or** applicant's parents must have attended at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout in the previous year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout.
- 5) If the Scholarship award recipient fails to attend school during the academic year for one full semester/quarter, the money must be returned to the Scholarship Fund. Recipient must submit a transcript from the school or college at the end of the first completed semester/quarter to the Scholarship Director. Transcripts must be receive by February 1st of the year following award receipt or return the award. Failure to comply shall render applicant ineligible for future scholarships.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year old honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

POLICY - TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.

2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Rain Gutter Regatta Racing will be coming to the Spring Campout in Hillsdale MI May 21 2016

"Just what is a Rain Gutter Regatta?"

The Rain gutter Regatta is a boat race that is designed to be a fun project for all ages. This is a chance to enjoy the spirit of friendly competition. These "Official Rain gutter Regatta Rules" are written to help you keep it simple and fun for everyone, and to know what to expect when it comes time to race your boat.

"Who can race?"

The leadership of MIFCRV always tries to keep our activities family oriented, so all ages can have fun. Anybody with an official boat may race (the campout will have some boats available for use at no cost). If preferred one can purchase a kit for \$6.00 on the updated campout registration form which must be submitted no later than April 30th so we can deliver the kits at the campout.

The race will be divided into the following classes:

Youth 1 up to age 9 **Youth 2** ages 10 - 12 **Teen** ages 13 - 19 **Family** any age can compete from youth to Adult

"Are there boat building rules?" (See page 13)

To ensure that the race is as fair as possible, all boats must be made from the Rain gutter Regatta kits. However, the materials supplied in the kit can be modified or added to somewhat. On every boat, the hull, mast, keel, rudder and sail provided in the kit must be used in the boat construction. Also, no other form of propulsion besides the sail is allowed. It is recommended the hull should be painted, stained, or otherwise finished to minimize water-logging during the race. Sail: Supplied in kit, may be trimmed but not enlarged or added to (except for decorations). Decorations/Additions: Objects such as sailors, cannons, etc. may be added. All such decorations must be firmly fastened to the boat, and may not be placed in such a manner as to exceed the boat dimensions

"What must I do to enter my boat?"

Before the race begins, all participating "Captains" must check-in their boats. Before a boat may compete in the regatta, it is subject to a technical inspection, to verify that it meets the prescribed specifications. If a problem is noted, the Captain may be asked to correct it before the boat is registered. When the boat passes inspection, it is then registered along with the boat Captain's name. Registration cutoff will be just prior to the start of the races for all participants. Boats that have not registered by the cutoff deadline will not race, so plan to arrive early enough to get your boat registered.

"How will the race be run?"

Every race has to have rules, and ours is no exception. Once all boats are registered, the competition brackets will be seeded. Each class will start by racing with others from their class. Winners from each race will compete until an overall winner is achieved. Each race heat will involve two equal lengths of rain gutter or approved track (approximately 10-feet long) filled with water. The race heat begins once the official starter has placed the competing boats against the back wall of the gutter and commands the yachtsmen to "GO!" On the starter's command, the yachtsmen will use a provided straw to blow into the sail of their boat in order to advance them through the water. Once the race has started, the yachtsmen CANNOT touch their boat with their hands, except to right a capsized boat. Pushing the boat forward is NOT allowed while righting a capsized or stuck boat by hand, nor is pushing by a yachtsmen's face, lips, hat, nose or other body part that touches the boat. Pushing may disqualify the yachtsmen during that race heat. Any disputed heat may be rerun at the discretion of the judges. The first boat to reach the finish line (the opposite end of the gutter) is the winner of that heat. The finish line officials will have the final and only say in determining the winner. In the unlikely event of a tie, the racers will be given a chance to catch their breath, then that heat will be rerun. If a boat is damaged during a race (boat loses its rudder, keel or mast/sail) and can be repaired in a reasonable amount of time (a few minutes), the race may be run again at the discretion of the judges. Any non-functional decorations that fall off during competition will NOT be reattached during racing. The race will be run as a double elimination format, with the winners of each heat advancing until the winners are determined for each class.

Raingutter Regatta Rules and Tips/Hints Sheet

Raingutter Regatta Rules

- Nothing may extend past front point or rear point of outriggers, so maximum total boat length is 6 3/4 inches
- Maximum boat hull width (not counting sail) is 3 3/8 inches if you have parts sticking
 out from sides you will hit the gutter and go slow
- Must use all parts from kit (2 outriggers, trimaran hull, 4 screws, mast, and sail)
- No motors or other power sources allowed, boats must run on Scout wind power only
- Mast must not be shortened and sail size must not be increased
- NEW RULE: Sails cannot be creased, folded or wrapped around boat mast must use two holes in sail and main sail between holes must not touch front of mast. See below for best "legal" sail configuration.
- NO WATER-BASED PAINT MAY BE USED DUH !!
- · Otherwise no restrictions on weight (remember, heavier is slower) or embellishments/decorations

Step 1: Shape the outriggers using sandpaper (or nail file)



Step 2: Assemble boat per instructions



Step 3: Paint your boat (with sail removed)

Spray paint looks the best and is easiest to do, but you can also paint with a brush if you don't have spray paint. The trick to a smooth finish is to use a SANDABLE primer first - I get mine from Home Depot - Rustoleum Painter's Touch Ultra Cover Primer (white) for about \$3 or even drywall primer paint like Kiiz. You can lightly sand the 1st coat before applying the 2nd coat of primer and then lightly sand the 1st coat before the color coat of spray paint. My favortie finish spray paint is Krylon gloss spray paint which is cheapest at Waimart (around \$3).

If you apply more than one finish color or a clear gloss coat, sometimes it will wrinkle the paint. I usually stay away from the clear gloss coats for this reason, and when you apply colors make sure they hit primer and not an underlying color. You can use masking tape to mask off the areas for the different finish colors (e.g. like a stripe down the middle, etc.).

Here are the recommended steps for painting your boat:

- 1. Wipe off any sanding dust from your boat Stick to with a tack cloth. Stick to hold on to
- Using tape, attach an old stick to the bottom of your boat which you can hold while painting.
- Apply two coats of primer paint, allow to dry 30 minutes between coats and 2 hours after the 2nd coat.
- Sand lightly with 320 grit sandpaper, then vacuum and/or wipe off dust with a tack cloth.
- Apply two or more light coats of spray paint of your choice.
