RV Electrical cord protector and adapter storage box

Occasionally you find the need to use a second electrical cord to make your connections. The issues I encountered when doing this was bad weather, mostly with flooding, which can trip your circuit and potentially cause a dangerous situation. Another issue I had was all the adapters I carry to help accommodate a successful hookup at the different rallies and RV Parks. Both issues are solved with a very simple fix. You take a plastic toolbox with a lid that overlaps the bottom box to prevent water leakage. Reinforce the sidewalls with wood which is glued and screwed. Then cut a groove that matches the curvature of your cord in it. Now when you need to use a second cord to make your connections just place them in the box with the cord running in the grooves. You can store all your adapters in the box while using this setup.



Now all your adapters are together in one neat container for storage and travel plus you don't have to worry about inclement weather affecting your connections.
