President's Message

The D.A.S.A.T. presentation at this year's Fall State Campout was about fraud and scams. So, I thought it appropriate to talk about scam emails that directly affect members of MSA.

These emails purportedly are sent by an officer of MSA. For example, I've gotten numerous such emails supposedly from Pete Schaub when he was President, and a few supposedly from Marci McIntoch as State Director. I've recently learned that others have recently gotten such emails supposedly from me, now that I am President.

The content of such emails can take on many different forms. Often, they say that there is an expense that needs to be paid, so could you please pay it via Paypal, Venmo, or Zelle and you'll get reimbursed. Sometimes they'll say that there is a need to purchase gift cards for something. Occasionally they'll have a very benign sounding message, such as "can we discuss something." My understanding is that the latter scam emails are fishing for a response, and, if they get one, then they'll follow up with a more detailed scam attempt. Usually, the details in these scam emails are somewhat vague, but I received one scam email that specifically mentioned MSA and Dave Mull in his role as Treasurer.

While I don't know this for certain, I suspect that scammers are getting our names and email addresses from them being in *The Michigander*, which is available online for anyone to see. Now that I am listed as President, I anticipate that in the future many scam emails will be sent out supposedly from me, just as many were previously sent out supposedly from Pete when he was President. Anyone whose email is listed in *The Michigander* (which includes all MSA officers and program directors) could potentially receive such emails.

Hopefully everyone is savvy enough to recognize these emails as scam attempts. But as scammers get more sophisticated, it might get harder to distinguish between scam and legitimate emails. If you have any question about the legitimacy of an email supposedly received from someone in MSA, you should contact that person not by replying to the email, but by calling them or by forwarding the email to the person (or sending a separate email), typing in their email address from *The Michigander* to ensure that it goes to that person and not to a scammer.

The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring or MSA State Fall campout.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year-old honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a <u>member in good standing</u>. (See policy below)

POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
- 2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or <u>lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension</u>. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Hello Everyone,

Camping season has come to a close by the time this Michigander edition is sent out. Sad to see the end to this season. The Retiree and Fall Campouts were great this year I'm glad we were able to attend both of them.

I kind of had a touch of writer's block for this article. While finishing the hand railings on the steps to our deck I got to thinking about Home Safety. With fall arriving I'm sure there's a couple projects around home we're all trying to finish before the weather changes. So, let's review some home safety information, the below suggestions are a brief listing of home safety ideas.

Home Safety

- 1. Make sure your home escape routes are clear of clutter and furniture. Don't forget escape routes in your garage, pole barn, out buildings and your RV. Include your meeting place as well.
- 2. Check your doors and windows, do they open, close, latch and lock properly. Is there easy access to them if you have to use them for an escape route.
- 3. Keep your stairways open and free of clutter to prevent slip, trip, and fall injuries.
- 4. Keep outdoor pathways like exterior entrances, garage doorways, approaches, driveways, sidewalks, and other pathways clear and free of debris, toys and other trip hazards. Also keep these areas well illuminated with available yard lighting, landscape lights and other outdoor lighting.
- 5. Purchase or build a family first aid kit.
- 6. Have an emergency contact list ready an available and not just on your cellphone. That way friends, neighbors, and relatives may assist in contacting someone if the need arises. List should include name, address and phone numbers of emergency contacts, doctors, pharmacy, poison control etc.
- 7. Check fire/smoke/CO2 alarms, and fire extinguishers are properly located and in correct working order. Change the batteries when you change your clocks.
- 8. Are your woodstoves, pellet stoves, fireplaces, furnaces, and other heating sources, including chimneys inspected, clean and filters changed.
- 9. Fuel for BBQ grills, lawn garden equipment, recreation vehicles, etc. properly stored.
- 10. Do you have a Go Bag/Bug out Bag/ Evacuation Bag ready to go at a moment's notice. Also do you have a checklist to accompany your bags, so you don't forget anything. Include a bag or kit for your children and pets.

Home Safety for Children

- 1. Cover electrical outlets.
- 2. Secure toxic substances, medications, cleaning products, lawn and garden products etc. out of reach of children and pets by storing them in a safe, secure location.

3. Use stairway safety gates to limit access to certain areas of your home for small children, such as stairways, balconies, kitchens etc.

- 4. Manage your trash receptacles, use locking lids/covers to keep children and pets from gaining access to trash.
- 5. Do your children know their address and emergency contact information and 911.
- 6. Know where everyone is before moving vehicles and equipment in your driveway and yard to prevent personal injury.
- 7. Keep firearms and ammunition secured and out of reach of children.
- 8. Assure house plants are non-toxic to children and pets.
- 9. Keep plastic bags, plastic wrapping materials and small items out of reach of children to avoid suffocation, choking

and other health hazards.

Home Safety for Pets

- 1. Have contact list for veterinarians, emergency pet clinics, pharmacy's, pet supply stores, evacuation shelters that accept pets, pet kennels.
- 2. Cover or secure electrical cords to prevent pets from playing with them and chewing on them.
- 3. Provide a secure, comfortable space for your pets to retreat to.
- 4. Keep decorations (birthday, holiday, etc.) and other small objects away from pets to prevent choking hazards.
- 5. Purchase or build a pet first aid kit.


