News from the MSA President

As of this writing the camping season is winding down in Michigan with only a few more campouts. The fall campout in Gladwin was a wonderful time for all that attended. Natures Nuts hosted it in honor of their 50th anniversary. The group pulled together to put on a great campout for this I commend them.

Unfortunately I need to touch on some tough subjects. The attendance was at an all-time low of 30 units and two activity passes. The Michigan State Association of the FCRV (NCHA) is funded by these campouts and unless we increase our attendance at these events the MSA future is in serious jeopardy.

Another thing we need to take a serious look at is the participation in our programs such as the Pageants. This year we had one Princess and one Teen King running. The present Teen Queen graciously agreed to reign another year so our State is represented at National. The previous Teenie Queen also agreed to continue her reign. The dilemma we are faced with is due to decline in attendance at State Campouts and participation in pageants.

Do we eliminate the pageants because it is a big part of our budget? The suggestion of elimination (which I am not suggesting at this time) will definitely stir up a lot of controversy and some anger. So my request is we put on our thinking caps and try to find a way that we can increase the attendance at the State Campouts and also get more participants in the pageants so they can continue on.

Another thing of importance is the individual Districts. The entire MSA needs to support the Districts by attending their mixers but also the Districts need to come together and support the State campouts too because the MSA future depends on it.

At present an inventory of all MSA owned equipment is being done and a report will be given to the board, which we will review and make our recommendations to the delegates as to what we should keep and how to dispose of the excess we no longer use. So please think about what I have said and let's work together to come up with a plan that the MSA can survive on.

The 2018 Spring Campout will be at the Branch County Fairgrounds in Coldwater on May 18, 19, 20th and as of this moment we still need a Fall Campout location and Chairman. If we can make a special effort to attend these campouts and try to bring other people with you it is a step in the right direction.

POLICY - TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.

2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. **This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension.** At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Next year we will be electing three Trustee positions as required by our constitution & bylaws. The positions we will be electing next year will be President, Vice President of Programs, and Recording/Corresponding Officer.

The election committee would like to have two candidates for each position. We have many qualified members that would be excellent Trustees. We need you to volunteer to run for one of these positions. Without volunteers, it is very unfair to ask the same people to serve year after year.

Our Stay at PLA-MOR Campground

This last August Ida and I have had the pleasure to stay at PLA-MOR Campground for the Indiana Woodcarvers Summer Camp. Along with enjoying the woodcarving, it is a pleasure to camp here.



The campground is just a short drive from the Michigan and Indiana State line. PLA-MOR Campground is located at: 2162 East U.S. 6 – Bremen, IN 46506. Nearby towns include Bremen as well as Nappanee, IN provide shopping and tourist opportunities. Nappanee attractions include the Amish Acres, Coppes Commons, The Nappanee Center, Dutch Village Market, and Antiques on the Square and not too far away are Mishawaka, Elkhart, and South Bend, IN for your larger shopping centers. With the popular Shippshewana, IN just under an hour drive helps make PLA-MOR even more inviting.

Joey & Danielle Frederickson have only owned the campground for about 3 years. They both have experience with campground management prior to purchasing PLA-MOR. They live on the grounds with their family. Joey has been very helpful to us both times that we have camped there. He is quick to take care of any problems that should arise and is professional as well as courteous.

Touring around the campground one might find fishing ponds, a lovely 18-hole putt-putt golf course, camp store, horseshoe pits, a driving range, there are playgrounds for the kids, lovely RV lots and much more. Some of the amenities like the putt-putt golf and the driving range do have small additional fees. There is also a large clubhouse that can be rented for company picnics, RV Rallies, etc. The 2018 Civil War Reenactment will be here the weekend before Father's Day.



The new pool will be a much welcomed addition!

PLA-MOR is an older campground that started by the previous owners. It started as a family camping area and grew from there. The original campground was in the woods and later expanded to the West. Another large addition was added in the 1990's including many more campsites and other upgrades.

The new owners are in the process of upgrading the campground in stages. One upgrade that was in the process at the time of our visit is a new swimming pool! In the future they intend to add "buddy sites" where campers can group camp in a circle with a center gathering area.

As far as the rates go they are reasonable in my opinion with varying prices according to what you get. Water & electric only was \$27 a night while full hookups with 50 amp electric, water & sewer were \$33 per night. Weekly, monthly, and seasonal rates are available too.
