News from the MSA President

Hello everyone,

Now that the camping season is in full swing, I hope everyone has a fun and safe season.

I would like to thank Chrystal Pallas from the tip of the Mitt chapter for taking on the fall campout which will be at the Gladwin County Fairgrounds. I am sure she would appreciate any help you want to give her.

The Delegates meeting at the spring campout covered a lot of things and made some important changes. The last few years the MSA campouts have been losing money due to low attendance. The board recommended that we streamline our spending at the campouts and made the following suggestions, that we change the way the pageant is done, by eliminating the tea and adopt a system that pretty much all of the other states are doing, which is anyone interested in running for the Teen and Youth Royalty will submit a resume/application to the Pageant coordinator.

If there is more than one applicant per position, the Pageant coordinator will get three judges from outside FCRV to choose a winner. We will eliminate the pageant, but the Royalty will be awarded a sash and crown at the Fall evening program and have time to perform a talent at all evening programs if they so choose. The delegates approved this, and it will go in effect next year. Please understand that we still will have our Teen King, Queen, Prince, Princess, Teenie King and Teenie Queen and ask that you support them as you always have and invite them to campouts. The pageant coordinator will assist the teen King and Queen to help prepare them for representing us at Campvention.

In another cost saving measure, we are downsizing the inventory in the MSA trailer with the goal to eliminate the need for it.

The campout budgets have been revised and will now be in effect. Please consider hosting a Spring or Fall Campout in 2020.

POLICY - TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20-year-old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20-year-old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.

2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. **This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension.** At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

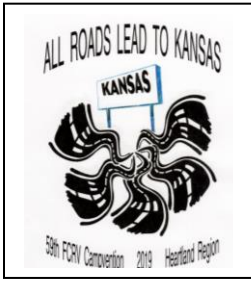

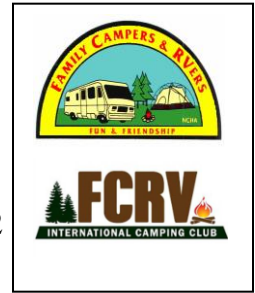

As of this email, there are 10 electric sites available (sites 112-122) and 17 various full hook up sites available in the campground. There is a map on the reservation site to show the location of open sites.

Camping fee is \$27/night for an electric site and \$32/night for full hook up sites.

For electric only sites, water is available.

Camping fees are non-refundable; however, if you cancel and someone else reserves your site, you will receive a refund minus \$15. There is a waiting list if the park fills.

They do not have a building, but the campsites are nice size and many of us have canopies.

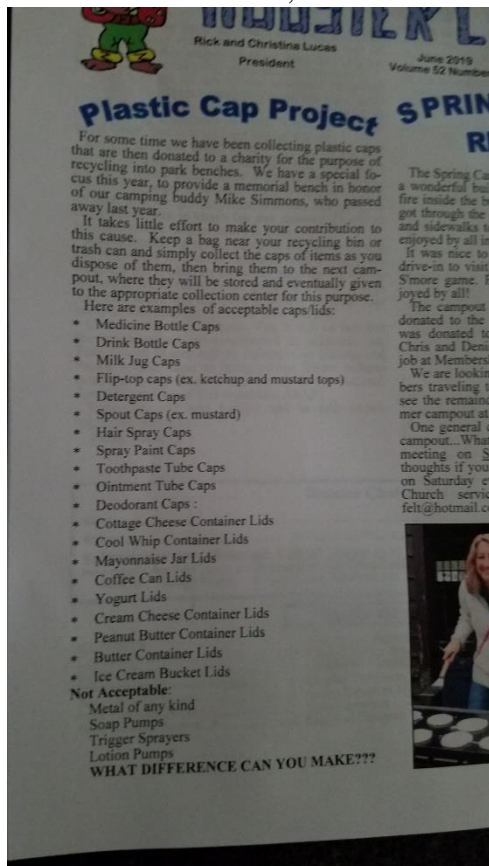
