
News from the MSA President

STATE DIRECTOR'S NEWS



It's never too early to start thinking about next year's scholarship application. As a rule, following is one of the requirement to be eligible to apply for a Scholarship: the applicant or applicant's parents must attend at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout this year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout. BUT, since some FCRV campouts were cancelled in 2021 due to COVID-19, the Scholarship board will waive the camping requirement for this season.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year-old honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

Disaster and Safety Awareness Training

Hello Everyone

My wife and I are sitting here talking about the Fall Campout in Harrison and what a great time we had along with everyone else. I'm trying to think of a subject to write about for this issue of the Michigander. I started to recall some of our questions and conversations we had during the DASAT presentation.

With the end of camping season slowly approaching along with the seasonal weather changes I was reminded that Fire Prevention Week is October 3- 9. Let's touch base on a couple of things.



First off check your smoke and carbon dioxide detectors. Test them, if they don't work change the batteries, normally changing batteries is done during daylight savings time. Also check the expiration date on the back of the detectors, some may not have an expiration date. These detectors normally have a life span of 5-7 years. Testing and checking your smoke and carbon dioxide detectors should be done on a regular basis, for instance monthly. Double check that you have the correct number of detectors in your home and RV along with them being mounted in the right location.

Secondly, continue your fire extinguisher checks and inspections.

Next if you have a fireplace, woodstove, or pellet stove check any wiring and motors operating fans/blowers, augers etc. Be sure there's no sign of abnormal wear and tear or damage that could cause problems. If possible, look at the fireboxes for any cracked or out of line firebrick, any missing mortar in the joints. Examine your chimney and chimney pipes for cracks, bad joints, creosote buildup, any sign of leaks or other possible damage. These inspections can be performed by professionals due to possibly climbing ladders for roof access.

Don't forget your kitchens. The holidays are not too far off. Remember when using your stove top keep the handles of your pots and pans turned inward away from the front edge of your stove. This will decrease the chances of you catching the handles with your hand/arm or your clothes. Also harder for curious kids to grab handles and get burned. Keep some baking soda or salt handy for stove top grease fires. Also have a lid or cookie sheet nearby to use to smother the grease fire and safely turn of the stove top burners. Use a dry chemical fire extinguisher as a last resort due to the contamination from the extinguisher a lot of kitchen supplies will have to be discarded.

Review your escape routes and meeting places in the event of a fire or other disaster. Make sure your escape routes are free and clear of anything that is blocking or hindering doorways, hallways and stairways. Be sure to review and practice your escape routes and meeting places with your family members. You'll need more than one escape route if you have a basement or multi story home.

Don't forget to have your natural gas, LP gas, fuel oil, electric furnaces and hot water heaters inspected.

Lastly, look at your driveway and parking areas at home. Is your driveway wide enough and clear of overhanging tree branches and limbs, or brush and bushes to close to the driveway for emergency vehicles if needed? Check if any items stored in or near your parking areas should be moved.

These are just a few highlights of things to think about for you and your family.

Fire Prevention week is coming up in a couple weeks (from today of article submission.) Many Fire/Rescue agencies will be holding open houses and other activities scheduled. Please support all your 1st Responders and visit their open houses and any programs they may sponsor.
