It is imperative we take these simple steps to adapt to how the camping world has and is changing around us. FCRV must push into these prominent platforms to remain visible and relevant to current and potential members. A viable website and social media presence will enhance our ability to gain new members and the commercial partnerships that help our organization fund itself.

Chapter email accounts have been created for fast, easy, and direct contact at the national level. Please contact us so we can give you those email addresses and passwords. Currently, all chapter emails received are forwarded to us.

The next step is to build a calendar of events, followed by recaps from these events where we can list on our website and social media for advertising. It's very important that we understand the need to better show what we do as an organization, and **your** help is needed.

If you have not recently been to www.fcrv.org, go look at the home page to see how much it has changed. Shown there is a small sample of events already submitted and the recaps for those events. The national office recently took control of FCRV social media. All platforms have been rebranded with graphic elements from our logo formatted to fit each social platform. You can find us on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Youtube @OfficialFCRV. This advertising process is playing out on all those platforms as well. If we can get everyone on board with these simple steps, FCRV will be advertising 500+ events per year. Our online footprint and connection to other camping related entities will massively grow at a rapid pace and we will start to get recognized as the powerhouse in the camping world we are. Initially this process will seem strange and may be frustrating, but we promise, the more you do it, the easier it will get. Once you make it a habit to submit events, you will learn how easy it is and we will all start to see the benefits as our organization grows. In fact, we are already seeing new members join through internet searches in just the last 3 months since going live with a new website and social media push.

SCHOLARSHIP NEWS



The holidays are over and time to start filling in our camping calendars for the 2022 season. And it's never too early to start thinking about your scholarship application and gathering the required documents and attachments. Deadline and requirements as follows:

- 1) Application deadline: June 1st
- 2) All applications mailed by U.S. mail must have a legible post office marked date stamp on the envelope to be accepted for judging. Applications emailed will be accepted or rejected by the date and time on the email when received not sent by the applicant.
- 3) Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale.
- 4) The applicant **or** applicant's parents must have attended at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout in the previous year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout.

As a reminder some of the FCRV campouts were cancelled in 2021 due to COVID-19, the Scholarship board will waive the camping requirement for the 2021 camping season.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year old honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

POLICY: TWENTY-YEAR-OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20-year-old Honorary Membership List. The name, address, and birth date of the 20-year-old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.

FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Disaster and Safety Awareness Training

Hello campers, I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and New Year holiday.

For this issue, the DASAT article will be a short 2-part reminder.

Rumor has it, it is winter. Looking out in our front yard you couldn't prove it. The yard is still green. I'm sure the northern lower peninsula looks different.

Considering it's Michigan at some point we're going to get some accumulating snow. Here are some reminders of things to look for and do throughout the winter. This is a short list; I'm sure depending on where you live the list could be longer and more detailed.

Have a contact list of friends, neighbors, and relatives to help with snow/ice removal or any other outdoor situation that could occur.

Keep your home entrance and exits free of snow and ice along with porches, decks, sidewalks, driveways, and parking areas.

Keep track of snow accumulating on your roof. Sometimes too much snow buildup can cause damage. Also check to be sure your vents for your furnace, hot water heater, clothes dryer or any other appliance is clear of snow.

Double check your carbon monoxide detectors that they're working properly.

Double check your vehicles for winter conditions for short and long-distance traveling.

Keep your fuel tank as full as possible.

Keep your tires at proper air pressure.

Windshield wipers are in good condition.

Windshield washer fluid full.

Engine/transmission fluids are at proper levels.

Put together a winter kit for your vehicle: flashlight and batteries, ice scraper, shovel, jumper cables, container of kitty litter.

Have a travel bag with spare change of clothes, some snacks, possibly extra prescription medications and bottled water.

Again, only a brief list of suggestions for our Michigan winter driving.

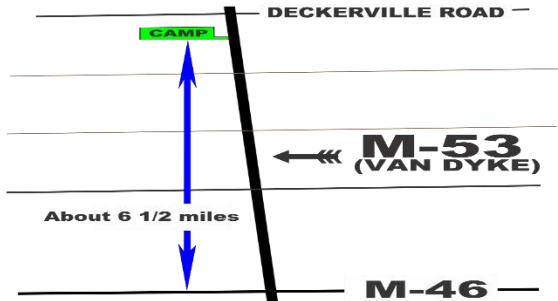

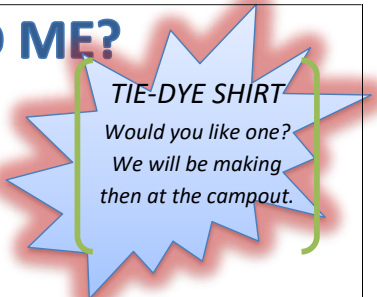
