STATE DIRECTOR NEWS

For those of us who remained in Michigan during the winter, it was sure a mild one...at least for us! Now we are ready to load up and head to the campgrounds this year. Are you ready?

Have you entered your chapter calendar for 2023 on our national website? When you click this <https://fcrv.org/admin-resources/> link, scroll down and select *Event Submission Form*. Please consider listing your chapter on our national website. If you need help, we would be happy to enter your schedule events. As of this article, our state and districts campouts are posted as well as some chapter events.

We would like to congratulate this year's high school graduate: Luke Kurburski. We know you have great things in your future, and we wish you the best.

Our Plastic Cap/Bench Project is complete! Here is a recap:

In the fall of 2020, we announced a recycling project that all Michigan Members could participate in. Green Tree Plastics <https://www.greentreeplastics.com/> located in Evansville, Indiana through their ABC Promise Partnership Program provides groups the opportunity to recycle plastic caps which are then made into benches. We shared with members that this would be a great way to give back to the three fairgrounds in Michigan where our district campouts are held along with supporting our environment. It was a hit with many of our members who began collecting caps. Then covid arrived.

The first opportunity for us to gather to sort and bag caps as a group was during Southeast District Campout in April 2022. Most who attended this campout helped sort approximately 300 pounds of caps. We continued this process during the Northern District Campout in June 2022. John also spent many days and weeks and hours solo doing the same.

We stored them in our barn until we had the required 600 pounds needed for three benches. Then we had a devastating barn fire on May 1, 2022, which was a total loss. We had approximately 400 pounds at that point all sorted and bagged. It was heartbreaking to share this news with our members after all the work that had been done so far on this project sorting, cleaning, even washing and drying caps that were to be placed into contractor bags.

The Indiana State Association heard of our dilemma and came to our rescue donating about 250 pounds of caps to our project. We also received approximately 350 pounds from our local girl scout troop. This was an amazing donation, and we could not have been more thankful! Paul and Diane Jones volunteered to store the caps in their barn.

Beginning in early February 2023 Paul and Diane Jones and us began the process of making sure all caps collected were acceptable. There are very strict guidelines for what caps are acceptable and in what condition. Then we learned that no medical-type plastic caps were allowed, such as EPI pen caps. So again, in early March with the help of Southeast District Directors, Jim and Donna Setzler we again sorted through our donations a second time to remove unacceptable caps.

If you are donating caps, please make sure you check their website for what is acceptable and the guidelines for collecting caps. This is VERY important towards the successful project.

Funding is also needed along with the caps to order each bench. With the generous donations of three Michigan Chapters; Eager Beavers, Roam 'n Oaks and Traverse Bay Travelers, funding was secured.

On March 23, 2023, Paul and Diane Jones towed their enclosed trailer and the four of us together drove the 720 miles round trip to Evansville to drop off our caps and pick up our benches. We are thankful for perfect traveling weather and great traveling companions!

At Green Tree Plastics, employees removed the 18 contractor bags that each held approximately 45 pounds of caps onto their conveyor process to make sure our caps were acceptable and yes, they are rated. We are happy to have received an A+ rating and then completed our journey home.

There are so many to thank for getting us to the point where we can finally deliver a bench to our fairgrounds for the many years of supporting our districts. We are very thankful for everyone who helped in this process, especially the Indiana State Association. Yes, it was quite an undertaking and even though there were setbacks, we continued with our vision until it was completed.

The Michigan State Association will continue to collect caps to give to the Indiana State Association for their ongoing project. Caps will also be collected during this year's Campvention. You can also give them to us! This was such a rewarding project in so many ways and we are pleased with the result. Ron O'Dell will make a plate to attach to each bench. We are looking for volunteers to take each bench to the prospective fairground.

We hope to see you in Richmond, IN for this year's Campvention. Many members from Michigan have stepped up to help make sure this is a great one! Thank you all!!

Scholarship News

Spring is in the air which means graduation is not far off. Time to gather the required documents and complete your scholarship application for submittal.

Scholarship deadline and requirements as follows:

- 1) Application deadline: June 1st
- 2) All applications mailed by U.S. mail must have a legible post office marked date stamp on the envelope to be accepted for judging. Applications emailed will be accepted by the date and time on the email.
- 3) Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale.
- 4) The applicant **or** applicant's parents must have attended at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout in the previous year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year old's honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20-year-old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20-year-old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
 2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. **This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension.** At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Disaster and Safety Awareness Training

Hello Everyone

Happy Spring, anyway I think it's spring! We got about 3 inches of snow during the night and it's forecast to snow all day today.

I just thought I'd review some National Weather Service (NWS) information like warnings, watches, advisories for fog, winds, thunderstorms, and tornadoes.

These are the Michigan weather events that most commonly affect us at home, travel, campgrounds, and other places in general.

Here are some general descriptions from the NWS. These are brief descriptions:

- Warning--Alert issued by a weather service agency to warn people of approaching weather.
- Watch--Alert issued to indicate conditions are favorable for dangerous weather patterns although the dangerous weather conditions may not currently present.
- Advisories--Indicates conditions pose a significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised could lead to situations that may threaten life and/or property.
- Dense Fog Advisory--Issued when widespread fog is expected to reduce visibilities to 1/4 mile or less for large area for extended periods of time, usually 2 or more hours.
- High Wind Warning--Issued when sustained winds of 40 mph or greater for more than 1 hour and/or wind gusts 58 mph or greater for any duration.
- High Wind Watch--Is for the most part the same as a High Wind Warning.
- Thunderstorm Warning--Indicates the warned area is in impending danger from high winds or straight-line winds, hail, lightning, rainfall with possibility of flash flooding along with possible tornado.
- Thunderstorm Watch--Indicates condition in and close to the watch area have created a significant risk for development of high winds, hail, straight line winds, intense lightning, rainfall with possibility of flash flooding and tornado.
- Tornado Warning-- Issued when a tornado is indicated by radar or sighted by spotters. People in affected areas should seek safe shelter immediately.
- Tornado Watch--Issued when conditions are favorable for the development of tornadoes in and close to the watch area.

Before weather warnings, watches, advisories are announced know where your safe areas are at home, campgrounds, public/private places for the safety of you and your family.

Your home safe areas are your basement, an interior room without windows on the lowest floor of your home, or an interior room under a sturdy piece of furniture. Campground safe areas may vary, usually the bathroom/shower areas. Check with the campground for other areas. Public/private areas may or may not have safe areas posted, listen for announcements for areas to go to.,

Again, this article is general information. For more weather information you may go online to the National Weather Service or your local weather service stations for more detailed information.

With all the recent disastrous events which have occurred locally and nationally. Use caution traveling near railroad crossings and be extra vigilant of your surroundings (situational awareness) wherever you may be.

See all ya'll this camping season. Be safe.

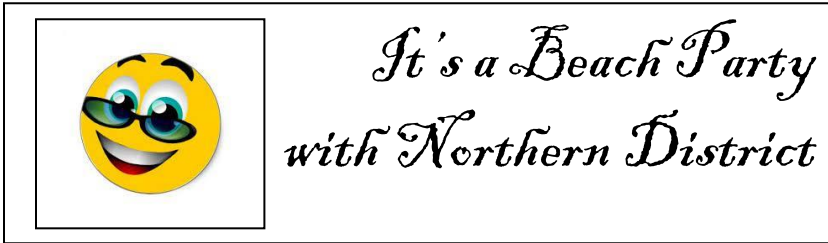
