#### POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20-year-old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20-year-old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
- 2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

#### C.A.M.P. Walks

In recent times C.A.M.P. (Campers Actively Moving Program) has been somewhat quiet in Michigan. I am hoping to change that. I have volunteered to be the C.A.M.P. director for Michigan. The first C.A.M.P. activity I have planned is for the Fall State campout, where I will lead narrated walking tours of historic downtown Coldwater. Coldwater has many beautiful and historic buildings; their historical society lists 42 such structures. On both Friday morning and Saturday morning I will lead a one-mile loop walk past some of these structures with narration about their historical significance. Saturday's walk will be different from Friday's walk. Once the one-mile loop is done each day, if there is interest, I will lead an optional additional one-mile walk to see more buildings. Since downtown is a bit of distance from the fairgrounds, the plan is to carpool to downtown Coldwater to start the walks. By fall I hope to make these walks official C.A.M.P. activities eligible to earn Vendor Bucks.

### Wing House Museum Tour

One of the activities planned for the Fall State Campout is a tour of the historic Wing House Museum in Coldwater. Step back in time to a less complicated life when water came from the well, there was a fireplace in nearly every room for heat, and all forms of elegance could be found from the décor to the glassware. The museum is an example of 19th century Second Empire architecture. It was built in 1875, then purchased by the Wing family in 1882, who lived there until 1974. It is now a museum and the home of the Branch County Historical Society. The tour will be at 1:30 on Saturday, Sept. 16. There is no cost that I am aware of.

# **Disaster and Safety Awareness Training**

Hello Everyone,

As I sit down to write this article I'm looking back over the last week or so thinking how busy it's been, MSA Spring Campout, prepping for DASAT program, and work, in three days I travelled to jobsites in Battle Creek, Marshall, Howell (twice), and Capac. Followed by family camping Memorial weekend.

During my recent travels I've noticed how some people or drivers operate on the roadways especially construction zones. I think I have racked up more miles in construction zones than driving non construction zones. My conclusion a few years ago some drivers are complete idiots.

So, let's just take a couple minutes and look at a couple things.

Before you strike out on a road trip or even just driving to run errands know your route, road construction is everywhere, city, rural and country roadways.

If you're heading out on a trip look at a map, yes, I said a map or check online for best routes, detours etc. Your GPS or cellphone may have info as well.

Before leaving Check out your vehicle, fluid levels, belts, and hoses, tire pressure, phone charger, water to name a few. Myself, I also carry a 1st aid kit, fire extinguisher and a set of reflective hazard triangles.

Here's a couple laws to review.

- Michigan Move Over Law
  - o Requires motorists to slow down and move over for stationary authorized vehicles with flashing, rotating or oscillating lights activated.
  - o I believe this law includes vehicles broke down alongside roadway as well.
- Roadway Work Zone Safety
  - The actual law is lengthy. Basically, where workers are present in a work zone maximum speed limit is 45 mph. Where no workers are present you drive the posted speed limit in that zone.

The state of Michigan is beginning to place Traffic Enforcement Cameras at work zones to photograph violators. Some areas are using Radar Speed Signs which have posted speed limit at the top and digital readout of your speed on the bottom. And don't forget the old standby of police stationary running their radar.

Let's not forget a little Railroad crossing information. Always approach crossings slowly. If it's lights and bells are activated, and the gates are lowered you should be stopped a minimum of 15 feet away. If no alarm system is present with only warning signs you should be stopped the same distance away.

If you ever get the chance to attend an Operation Lifesaver program (Railroad Crossing Safety) please take it, it's a very informative presentation. For those of you that were at the MSA Spring Campout. Remember the blue sign?

These are just some items to remember to keep us all safe, drivers, families, vehicles, RVs, and construction workers.

As always be safe.


