Happy New Year! The holidays are over. We're all looking at our 2024 calendars planning our camping season and you seniors are looking forward to graduation. It's a good time to start thinking about your scholarship application and gathering the required documents and attachments. Deadline and requirements are as follows:

- 1) Application deadline: June 1st
- 2) All applications mailed by U.S. mail must have a legible post office marked date stamp on the envelope to be accepted for judging. Applications emailed will be accepted or rejected by the date and time on the email when received not sent by the applicant.
- 3) Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale.
- 4) The applicant **or** applicant's parents must have attended at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout in the previous year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year old honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

Be sure to apply for a national scholarship; the contact information is at the bottom of the Michigan scholarship application. POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.

2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension. At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Disaster and Safety Awareness Training

Happy New Year Everyone, I hope everybody had a blessed, happy and safe Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year Holiday season and celebration.

I've been thinking about what to write for this Michigander edition. So while scrolling through or TV satellite channel guide (250 channels of nothing to watch) I came across an old Perry Mason show, The Case of the Meddling Medium, which kind of got me thinking (yes, I know scary, me thinking)

The Case of What Do We Do in Case of an Emergency? Here's some examples of scenarios to think about.

In the Case of you traveling somewhere alone or with someone and your vehicle breaks down, a traffic accident occurs, or during wintertime driving weather conditions change for the the worse and you end up in the ditch or stranded along the roadway. What do you do? What do you not do? Who do you contact? etc.

In The Case of you working in the kitchen, garage, shop, yard, woods, and you cut yourself or severely injure yourself somehow using knives, power tools, and equip, yard tools, chainsaw, or fall from a ladder. Do you know what to do? Do you know where you're at? Can you give directions to your location? Can you treat yourself until help arrives? etc.

In The Case of walking/hiking, biking, boating/tubing, trail riding and something happens. Again do you know what to do? Who to call? Did you tell anyone where you were going or what you were going to do? Do you know your location? etc.

In The Case of being at home, shopping, at a restaurant, visiting someone, on vacation etc. and a weather event, non-emergency or emergency incident/ or disaster occurs, do you shelter in place or leave? What if an evacuation order is given?

What do you do?, Who do contact to let them know what you're doing and where you're going? What route are you taking? What don't you do? What can you take with you? etc.

In The Case of an Emergency and What Do I Do, the need to call for assistance or call 911 will arise. Not to keep repeating some of these questions and statements but do you know who to call, when to call, do you know your location or address? What if there's no cell service or your cell phone isn't working. Can you call, text or email for help? What if there's also a problem with you're land line if you have one? Modern technology is great until it doesn't work, then some people are lost on what to do. Do you have a communication back up plan to summon help if needed? There are more questions you you should be asking yourself and thinking about. Below are some examples of alternate communication for emergency and non-emergency uses. Some are fairly inexpensive and others are more costly. Some of you may already have a back up plan.

Alternate communication systems are not limited to this list.

Various Cell phone Apps (if cell phone service is available) Satellite Messenger Walkie Talkies GMRS 2-Way Radios MURS (multi use radio service) 2-Way Radios

Satellite Cell Phones Personal Locator Beacon HAM Radio CB Radios

Also In Case Of Emergency What Do I Do to help yourself, your family, friends, and even strangers here's some suggestions.

Take a First Aid coarse, Learn CPR/AED, Buy and learn to use GPS or Compass, Get a First Aid Kit or make your own for home, your vehicle, shop, RV. etc. Create a pre-plan, check list, go bag for traveling, camping etc. Also sometimes let your spouse, family, or friends know where you're going, doing, travel route, length of time involved. Just in case of.

If anyone would like help in creating some type of emergency plan, first aid kits, go-bags, checklists, backup communication system, please contact me, I'd be more than happy to help you out in any way I can. There are numerous resources available.

Cranberry Bliss Bars

BLONDIE LAYER:

- ³/₄ cup (1¹/₂ sticks) salted butter, cubed
- 1½ cups packed light brown sugar
- 2 large eggs
- ¾ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2¹⁄₄ cups all purpose flour
- 1¹/₂ teaspoons baking powder
- ¹⁄₄ teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¹/₂ cup dried cranberries
- 6 ounces white baking chocolate, coarsely chopped

FROSTING:

- 8 ounces cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted
- 6 ounces white baking chocolate, melted
- ¹/₂ cup dried cranberries, chopped

Instructions

 Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Spray a 13x9-inch baking dish with nonstick spray.

PREPARE THE BLONDIE LAYER:

 In a medium bowl, melt the butter for one minute in the microwave; stir in the brown sugar. Scrape the



butter and sugar into a large bowl and let cool to room temperature. Use an electric mixer to beat in the eggs and vanilla. In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon; gradually add the dry mixture to the butter mixture. Stir in the cranberries and chopped chocolate (the batter will be thick).

2. Spread the blondie batter into the prepared pan. Bake for 18 to 21 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean (do not over bake). Cool completely on a wire rack.

PREPARE THE FROSTING:

 In a large bowl, use an electric mixer to beat the cream cheese and powdered sugar until well-blended. Gradually add half of the melted white chocolate; beat until blended. Frost the blondies. Sprinkle with cranberries. Drizzle with remaining melted white chocolate. Cut into 30 bars- square or triangle-shaped. Store in the refrigerator until ready to serve.
